- January Committee members present shows about the Arctic Convoys and Russian Culture at the Kennebunk Free Library. The "Russian North" Photography Exhibition is at the Canden Memorial Library.
- February The "Russian North" Exhibition is displayed at the Camden Opera House as part of therCamden Conference theme "Russia Resurgent".
- March Our Committee joins with the Archangel Training Center for Rescue Organizations and applies for a federal grant covering a firefighter exchange. The "Russian North" Exhibition is displayed at the Language Exchange as part of Portland's First Friday Art Walk.
- April Delegations from Westbrook High School and Casco Bay High School visit Archangel and participate in "America Week' activities. The Award Ceremony for the "Day in the Life of the City" contest is held at the Center of Traditional Northern Culture.

- August The Portsmouth New-Hampshire Severodvinsk Sister City Relationship completed a friendly merger with our Archangel Committee.
- September We are awarded a large grant for our Firefighter Exchange by the U.S. Embassy in Moscow as part of the Peer-to-Peer Grant Program.
